Contact Jim or Val if you are interested in joining us camping at Wolf Creek WI, to ride the equine trails in the Governor Knowles Forest. Camp overnight or just do a day ride – we will leave camp around 10:30 am on Saturday.

Non-riders are welcome, come and enjoy the day and campfire Saturday night!

Driveway to camp area is just north of **Wolf Creek Bar, 2387 River Rd, Saint Croix Falls, WI 54024**

#### Directions:

- Go East at Stacy Exit off I-35 on Stacy Trail ~7.5 miles
- Turn Right (south) on Lincoln Rd/CR14 for 1/3 mile
- Turn Left (east) on Hwy 8 ~ 11.3 miles
- Turn Left (north) on Hwy 87 ~ 10.9 miles
- Turn Left (west) on 240<sup>th</sup> Ave / CR G ~ 3.5 miles
- Turn Left (south) on River Rd for a very short distance ~ .1 mile
- Driveway to the Horse Camp area is on the north side of the Wolf Creek bar
- Camping is \$10 per rig



## Tentative Schedule:

- Arrive Friday evening
- Dinner on your own and group campfire Friday evening
- Saturday breakfast – on your own
- Ride leaves Saturday at 10:30 am. We will ride approx. 2½ hrs before stopping for lunch on the trail (can bring your own sandwiches/munchies). Then ride approx. 2½ hrs back to camp.
- Dinner for purchase at the Wolf Creek Bar and campfire Saturday evening so bring a chair
- Sunday breakfast – on your own
- Shorter ride leaves Sun at 10am



## WHAT TO EXPECT:

- Camping area is primitive
- Porta potty on site
- Bring water for you and your horse
- Horse pens are allowed or you may tie to your trailer
- Each rider 16+over needs a Wisconsin Trail Pass (available for purchase at the camp \$25 annual or \$5 daily)
- Terrain is sandy, shoes not required
- Scenery is beautiful oak ridges and single file trail along the Trade River
- Mapped with trail markers
- River crossings are on bridges, some water crossings if you choose
- Bugs should not be bad but bring repellent
- We know the trails well and will keep a slow pace

In our opinion, these are great trails for spring riding and a nice campground, and it's about 35 miles from the NW Saddle Club grounds.
